
Fifty & Forward The Campaign for the Next 50 Years





2024 Annual Report

This year, San Diego Foundation reached an important milestone— \$1.8 billion in grants to nonprofits since 1975, thanks to our donors. After reaching \$1 billion in grants in 2016, we've nearly doubled that figure in just eight years. With \$114.5 million granted this past year alone, our donors and partners continue to support nonprofits making a meaningful difference.

Donors and partners like you made 2024 another remarkable year for SDF and San Diego. Together, we helped San Diegans furthest from opportunity. The first-ever San Diego Fundraising Conference helped our local nonprofit community strengthen its fundraising to better serve our region and its diverse needs. Last fall, the San Diego Economic Equity Report highlighted how much work we need to do to realize just, equitable and resilient communities that provide access to opportunity for all San Diegans.

In January and February, SDF and donors gave \$1.4 million to support survivors of historic devastating floods in our region, from providing a temporary home to serving a warm meal to helping survivors access mental health services. In July, the Community Scholarship Program awarded a record-breaking \$4.9 million in scholarships to 1,200 San **Diegans** to realize their dreams of attending college while building up our local workforce.

This summer, the Early Childhood Initiative once again partnered with the Dr. Seuss Foundation to support young children and families with \$1.3 million in grants to local nonprofits.

The Healthy Children & Families Initiative partnered with the San Diego Women's Foundation to support the expansion of mental health resources for children and adolescents with \$875,000

in combined grantmaking to build up mental resiliency and a sense of belonging among our region's young people. We also celebrated receiving \$42 million in grants from state and federal sources to help fund climate-resilient projects to preserve, protect and strengthen San Diego's central historic barrios. This will allow our neighbors to breathe freely, experience lower utility bills and access community resources that will benefit everyone during the next heat wave or flood.

And next year will be even bigger-throughout our 50th anniversary year in 2025, we'll celebrate at local events and raise awareness of the work we do, together, with our donors and partners. San Diego Foundation is grateful to our donors for their commitment to the community and for aligning their grantmaking with us to create a greater collective impact in San Diego County. When we work together, we can make a big impact for San Diegans.

In partnership with donors, foundations, municipal partners and corporations, we granted \$114.5 million through 8,509 grants to 2,313 nonprofits during the 2023-2024 fiscal year. During the past year, donor-advised giving amounted to 65% of our grantmaking, while the remaining 35% went towards our Strategic Plan priorities that focus on the greatest challenges in our region.
